Our performance network gives you access to some high-performing specialists.

Specialty doctors and doctor groups with the Aexcel designation:

- are part of the Aetna network of health care providers
- have met certain industry-accepted practices for clinical performance
- have met Aetna's efficiency standards

Visit doctors in these 12 areas:

- Cardiology (heart and blood)
- Cardiothoracic (heart and chest) surgery
- Gastroenterology (digestive system)
- General surgery
- Neurology (nervous system)
- Neurosurgery (spinal column, spinal cord, brain and nerves)
- Obstetrics and gynecology (pregnancy and women's reproductive system)
- Orthopedics (bones and joints)
- Otolaryngology/ENT (the ears, nose, throat (ENT), and head and neck)
- Plastic surgery
- Urology (urinary tract and urogenital system)
- Vascular (veins and arteries) surgery

Frequently asked questions:

How do we choose specialists for Aexcel designation?

We review clinical quality and efficiency.

We track:

- hospital readmission rates after 30 days
- rates of health complications during hospital care
- other treatments, by specialty, shown to improve outcomes

The above measures require that doctors have a certain minimum number of Aetna cases in order to be reviewed on these measures. The measures are based on recognized standards from organizations like the National Quality Forum (NQF), AQA, National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA), American Board of Medical Specialties, American Osteopathic Association, American Heart Association, American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists, Agency for Health Research and Quality, Society of Thoracic Surgeons, and Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services.

Health insurance plans are underwritten or administered by Aetna Life Insurance Company (Aetna).

In addition, doctors may pass the clinical quality criteria if:

- At least 75% of specialists in a group are recognized by either Bridges to Excellence (BTE) or the NCQA in the areas of diabetes, cardiac/stroke or low back/spine; or
- At least 75% of specialists in a group have Board Certification in their Aexcel specialty (Note: Board-eligible status does not meet this requirement); or
- At least 75% of specialists in a group have earned BTE or NCQA Physician Office Link recognition or apply NQF-endorsed measures on using health information technology; or
- The doctor practices at an Aetna Institutes of Quality® (IOQ) facility and his/her primary specialty is the specialty for which the facility is recognized for IOQ.

Efficiency

We also review the costs of treating Aetna members in each of the 12 Aexcel areas of care. We try to include all costs — not just visits to the doctor's office.

We review inpatient, outpatient, diagnostic, lab and pharmacy claims. Then we compare the total costs of care from each doctor to the costs of other doctors in the same region.

The doctors who best meet these qualifications are chosen to receive the Aexcel designation.

How can I find an Aexcel-designated doctor?

You can look in your printed Aetna directory to find doctors with this designation. Aexcel-designated doctors have an asterisk next to their name.

Or you can visit our DocFind® online provider directory at www.aetna.com. Aexcel-designated doctors have a blue star next to their name.

Do I need a referral to see an Aexcel-designated doctor?

Usually not. Please check the back of your Aetna ID card for referral requirements.

Will I pay extra?

No. In fact, you'll reduce your out-of-pocket expenses compared to visiting a specialist who does not have the designation. Plus, doctors with the Aexcel designation have been shown to work efficiently within the health care system. That is good news for your health ... and your health care budget.

What if a doctor is part of a group?

If a doctor is part of a group, we evaluate the entire group. In this case, performance-measurement results of other doctors in the group affect each individual doctor's evaluation.

NCQA background

The NCQA is an independent not-for-profit organization that accredits and evaluates a wide range of health care organizations and recognizes physicians in key clinical

areas. Its mission is to improve the quality of health care. NCQA serves as an independent examiner for Aetna, reviewing how Aetna's Aexcel program meets criteria required by the State of New York and national principles of the Patient Charter established by the Consumer-Purchaser Disclosure Project.
